[I. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes]

The minutes were unanimously adopted.

[II. Human Resources for 2025–2026]

- Announcement via Pronote: Two new teachers will start on April 7 (post-vacation) to replace Ms. Diviana Amarnani (Mr. Dante Burger) and Mr. Nick Wu (Ms. Sarai Flores Enriquez).
- End-of-year departures: Neeta Amarnani, Pierre Stordeur, Didier Nibert.
- Five new positions for September: Mathematics (1), Life and Earth Sciences (1), History-Geography-Latin (1), Chinese (1), and Student Life Staff (1).





 Ten new staff members will join in 2025, reflecting the school's growth. Recruitment concluded with nearly 200 applications received.

[III. Accreditation Extension]

- The application received preliminary approval; the school is now a "candidate for accreditation."
- An interministerial commission will conduct an audit in April, including
 administrative reviews and classroom observations (focusing on 8th, 9th,
 10th, and 11th grades). Additional visits to the middle school will occur due
 to the current accreditation's remote evaluation during the pandemic.
- The commission will meet with student/parent representatives, staff, management, diplomatic officials, and tour the future campus.
- Final results will be published in the Official Bulletin in June.

Implications of Non-Accreditation:

- Inability to hire teachers seconded by the French Ministry of Education.
- Additional exemptions required for high school scholarship applications.
- Students must travel to Hong Kong for exams as "school candidates."
- Partial reliance on CNED (National Center for Distance Education) programs.

[IV. Continuing Education]

- Reduced training fees from AEFE allowed 10 teachers to attend professional development programs.
- Participants are expected to share insights with their teams upon return.

[V. 2025 Exam and Certification Schedule]

- **Ev@langues** (language proficiency test): April 7 (9th grade).
- ASSR 1 & 2 (road safety certificates): May 13 & 15 (free for students).
- DNB Oral Exams: May 29 & 30.
- **DNB Written Exams**: June 15 & 16 (open to external candidates from Shenzhen).





Baccalaureate and Preliminary Exams:

Staggered throughout June by subject.

[VI. Internships]

9th-grade internships (week of February 24) received positive feedback. A
"company directory" will be created to support future internships, with
coordination for 10th-grade internships in June.

[VII. Extracurricular Activities (AES)]

- Low parent survey response (12 replies). Key feedback: Improve communication with activity supervisors.
- Existing AES programs will continue. Fewer offerings in Q3 (33→29) due to low participation in new activities (Ancient Greek, Baseball, Music/Choir).

[VIII. Events and Projects]

• March 22: Pétanque tournament (registrations ongoing). The school thanks parent organizers for their efforts.

 Programs finalized; consulates notified for emergency adjustments.
